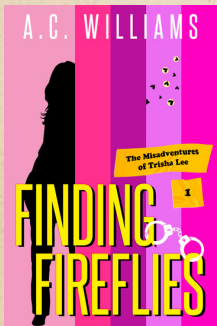




COZY TEA LIST

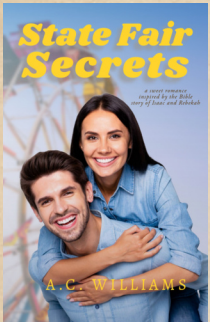
Spice Dragon Red Chai (Stash)

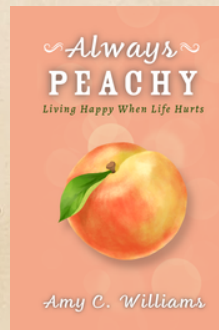
Vanilla Peppermint (Yogi)

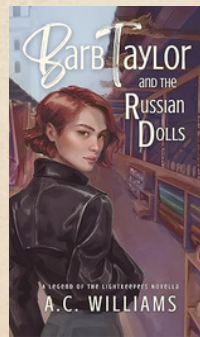
Wild Sweet Orange (Tazo)
